Professor Stephen Davis

President, World Stroke Organization



Professor Davis is the Director of the MBC-RM. He is the inaugural Professor of Translational Neuroscience at the University of Melbourne. At the Royal Melbourne Hospital (RMH), he is Director of Neurosciences and Continuing Care and Director of Neurology.

Professor Davis is the immediate past-President of the Australian and New Zealand Association of Neurologists (ANZAN) and a past-President of the Stroke Society of Australasia. He was the first Co-chair of the Australasian Stroke Trials network and Co-Chair of the World Stroke Academy.

In 2012, Professor Davis was appointed President of the World Stroke Organization. He is the Co-Chair, with Professor Geoffrey Donnan, of Neuroscience Trials Australia (NTA).

Professor Davis is based at RMH where he is the Director of Neurosciences and Continuing Care, Director of Neurology and Director of the Melbourne Brain Centre (MBC). He has been a trustee of The Royal Melbourne Hospital Neuroscience Foundation since its formation in 1992.

Professor Davis is a Consulting Editor for Stroke and Associate Editor for Cerebrovascular Diseases. His major research interests involve clinical trials in stroke and the use of neuroimaging, particularly multimodal MRI, in the selection of acute stroke treatments.
